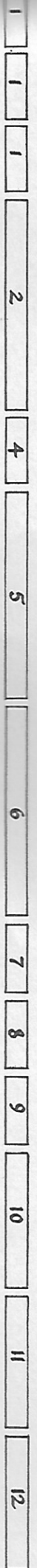

The front line was approximately 1000 yards long and curved away from the government line with the MacDonalds on the left wing further away and down a slight slope. Ranks varied from three to six deep with approximately 3000 men in the front line and about 1000 in the second. The line was constantly shifting and changing as new units joined it and there were repeated cries from the officers to 'close up' government troops in the foreground (seven grenadiers from Ligomer's regiment and one officer from Cobham's dragoons) have been put in for scale.
